## The Screening Training Unit's Team members

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### **Cervical Screening Education Programmes**

CervicalCheck's Screening Training Unit offers two pathways to achieving cervical screening accreditation. The STU delivers education in partnership with three Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) and through our own education programme, which is tailored to the needs of both novice and experienced sampletakers. Here's a step-by-step guide to get you on the right path:

- Create an Account: To begin your educational journey, please create an account on our elearning portal, which can be found <u>www.nssresources.ie</u>. It's crucial to use your correct NMBI/MCRN PIN as this will serve as your unique identifier within CervicalCheck.
- **2. Login and Explore:** Once you have your account set up, log in and navigate to the "Application Process" section, which provides an overview of your available options.
- 3. Course Details:
- Novice Education Course: This includes both theoretical and clinical components. The
  theoretical component is completed online and at a face-to-face 3-hour clinical workshop, and
  the clinical component is undertaken in your workplace. This course usually has a closing date
  approximately four weeks before the clinical workshop (see locations of clinical workshop
  below).
- Experienced Education Course: This programme is open for applications throughout the year, and the theoretical component is delivered entirely online and the clinical component is undertaken in your place of work.
